



PROFILE OF KUMBI COLLEGE:

Kumbi College, Kumbi established on September 27, 1981, is a co-educational institution offering quality higher education in an economically and educationally backward region of Manipur. Registered under the Societies Act, XXI of 1860, the College is affiliated to Manipur University by adhering to sections 2(f) and 12-B of the UGC.

Situated on a 7.17 acres serene campus in Lairam Tolomba, Kumbi, Bishnupur District, approximately 55 km from capital Imphal with notable for its proximity to Loktak Lake and Keibul Lamjao National Park, it provides a 4-year undergraduate program across 17 disciplines in Arts and Science streams promoting holistic education without discrimination.

The College has accredited by the NAAC with a “B” grade and a CGPA of 2.42 and recognized for its contributions to College Development in 2021-22 by the Directorate of University and Higher Education, Govt. of Manipur.

The envisaged vision and mission of the institution highlights the college's goal of providing quality education and fostering societal consciousness. With a boasts of the 83 regular teaching staff, including 22 PhD holders, augmented by 52 non-teaching personnel, the College exists the facilities of the ICT-equipped classrooms, laboratories, a computer lab, a digitized library, an indoor stadium, a women’s hostel, and a canteen, all monitored by CCTV with Wi-Fi and LAN access.

The academic and extracurricular activities are supervised by an Academic Committee and the Internal Assurance Quality Cell (IQAC), promoting inclusive participation with the initiatives of the College Legal Aid Clinic, National Service Scheme (NSS) units, Eco Club and Youth Red Cross emphasize teaching-learning processes, professional ethics, sustainability, and environmental awareness.

The College also facilitates comprehensive education through various hands-on experiences, debates, quizzes, and online resources, aiming to groom students from rural backgrounds into morally and intellectually capable citizens for a peaceful and harmonious society.

It committed to social justice, equity, meeting economic needs, and enhancing human resource access. The College focuses on enabling students to reach their highest potential in intellectual, physical, and creative realms, fostering global competencies, instilling values, and promoting technology use for the advancement of the country's higher education. Admission to 1-Year Bachelor's Certificate Program in a Discipline:

- A student who passed (10+2) level is eligible for admission to the 1-year Bachelor's Program with **major in a core subject from any of the above discipline.**
- The **Bachelor's Certificate** in any discipline is awarded at the end of the 1st year with exit option, if the student studied of 4 papers (24 credits) in Core Courses (CC), 2 papers (8 credits) in Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 papers (8 credits) in Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 papers (8 credits) in Value Addition Courses (VAC) with a total of 48 credits.
- All the students admitted to Bachelor's program shall be mandatorily registered their credentials unique ID issued by the **Academic Bank of Credit (ABC)** with the University.

- A **Bachelor's Diploma** in that discipline is awarded at the end of 2nd year with exit option, if the student studied of 6 Core papers (36 credits) in that discipline, 2 papers (4 credits) in VAC and 2 papers (12 credits) in Generic Elective courses (GEC) with a total of 52 credits.

Admission to 4-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours in that Discipline:

- A candidate who passed a Bachelor's Degree with CGPA not less than 7.5 is eligible for admission to the 4-Year Bachelor's program with major in the **same core subject** in which he/she obtains the Bachelor's Degree.
- A **Bachelor's Degree with Honours** in that discipline is awarded at the end of the 4-Year, if a student studied of 4 Core papers (24 credits) in that discipline, 2 papers (12 credits) in DSE and 2 papers (12 credits) in GEC with a total of 48 credits.

DEFINITION OF KEY WORDS:

Academic Bank of Credit (ABC): A facility developed by National e-Governance Division, Govt. of India for opening academic account by students and on boarding of eligible Higher Education Institutions. ABC will digitally store the academic credits earned by the students from the college registered with ABC ID for awarding degrees/diplomas/certificates.

- Student will create a link in www.abc.gov.in on the college for ABC ID and the same will fill up on all examination form.
- Student is provided multiple entries and exit options with certificate/diploma/degree from one Institution to another to have a multidisciplinary learning.

Credit: A credit is the quantum of workload required for a course in hour per week.

- 1-credit is taken as 1 hr. of lecture/tutorial per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, 1-credit lecture/tutorial is equivalent to 15 periods/15 hours of engagement.
- 1-credit for practical/field work means 2-hrs of engagement per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a 1-credit for practical/field work is equivalent to 30 hours of engagement.
- In term of evaluation, 1-credit is generally equivalent to 25 marks in a semester.

Semester: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year. The odd semesters shall be scheduled from June/July to November/December, and even semester from November/December to April/May. Each semester will consist of 15 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The curriculum for 4-yr undergraduate program shall be based on CBCS system, which provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate to be completed by the students.

Evaluation and Distribution of Marks for 4-Year Bachelor's Programs:

- MU shall conduct the End Semester Examination of 75% marks and remaining 25% marks by the Colleges as Internal Assessment (IA) Exam for the papers under CC, AECC, SEC, GEC, and DSC.
- A theory paper having 100 marks (4-credits) shall have the end semester examination for 75 marks and IA for 25 marks.
- A theory paper having 150 marks (6-credits) shall have the end semester examination for 115 marks and IA for 35 marks.

- IA Exam for SEC (2-credits) without practical opted for B.A./B.Sc. shall conduct 50 marks by the College whereas, SEC with practical opted for B.A./B.Sc. shall have no IA exam internally.
- Both IA & End Semester Exam for all courses under VAC shall be conducted and evaluated internally by the College as per the guidelines of the MU.
- For the distribution of 25 marks for IA, 20% shall distribute as Test/Assignment/Field work/Project work and 5% from attendance.

Grade Point for 4-Year Bachelor's Programs:

A candidate shall be declared to have passed a Bachelor's Certificate/Diploma/Degree/Degree with Hons, if he/she secures at least CGPA of 4.0 ('P' Grade) in 10-point grading system in all the credit courses of 4-Year Bachelor's Programs.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE:

Women's Hostel: The College has a hostel with well-managed mess for girl students hailing from remote villages. The physical facilities like Indoor Stadium, well-equipped gym with necessary components and botanical garden is also available in the campus for girl students.

Library: A medium size library automated with KOHA 2020 software located in a separate block is available for students to access freely e-books, e-journals through N-List. The library has a reading room of seating capacity for 35 students along with the collection of more than 6500 books, journals, magazines, periodicals. The library is under the surveillance of CCTV camera equipped with 30-50 MBPS bandwidth Wi-Fi and LAN facilities are available.

Alumni Association: With a zeal to render whatever support moral or physical, cash or kind to the college and wherever opportunity comes or situation demands, ex-students of the college has formed “**Kumbi College Alumni Association**” under the registration no. MH/1530/2017. The College is proud of having an Alumni Association formed by one-time students of the college, most of whom are now holding prestigious posts. The Alumni is always a gesture of moral or physical support for the wellbeing and development of the college and have a sense of gratitude, devotion, and dedication. So far, more than 60 alumni had registered under the webpage of the Kumbi College Alumni Association.

Games & Sports: The College has an Indoor Stadium with necessary components for using Badminton, Gym and other Indoor Games & Sports activities. A medium size playground with an approximate area of 1.58 acres accommodating Football, Volleyball, and Athletics Events are available in the campus. The College has been organized various State Level Tournaments under the aegis of Manipur University and encourages healthy spirit amongst the students to participate in the National and State Level Tournaments.

National Service Scheme (NSS): The College has 3 (three) NSS units under the control of senior faculties as a program officers to achieve holistic development of students. The NSS volunteers are exposed to the social and environment problems faced mainly by the less privileged section of the rural society in the neighborhood community through various activities such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Oral Health Camp, AIDS/HIVS Awareness Camp, and Blood Donation Camp. They organized Tree Plantation and Construction of Roads in the adopted villages to create awareness amongst the people about the role of clean environment in human health and extends their service whenever natural calamities occur in the areas.

Students’ Body: The Kumbi College Students’ Union, a body of 8 (eight) elected secretaries act as the executive of any affair pertaining to college development in academic, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities during their term. Each secretary, during his/her period, proposes plans something new and useful to the college, and betterment of the students under the supervision of the teacher’s in-charges and the principal. Organization of study tour and excursion, publication of magazine, performance of social work, cultural programs, literary meet, participation of various State/National/International competitions and sports events are some of the major items undertaken by the union.

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell): With a view of the action plan of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) for assessment and accreditation of Institutions of Higher Education of India, IQAC has been formed at Kumbi College to take care of quality assurance strategies, sustenance measures & processes, to develop a system for conscious, consistent, and catalytic improvement in overall performance of the college. On May 24, 2022, the IQAC make a significant contribution with ‘B’ grade accreditation of 2.42 CGPA by promoting its academic excellence.

Legal Aid Clinic: The Legal Aid Clinic at the college greatly benefits the public who need settlement of disputes and legal advice but could not afford adequately, with less effort, without payment, less time and energy. A team of Para Legal Volunteers is assigned the responsibility to solve the problems for visiting ignorant general people regarding their rights, facilities bound to enjoy, and deprived opportunities to help bridge of communication gap between their families from time to time. The Legal Aid Clinic, Kumbi College has been organized various legal awareness programs in and around Kumbi in association with Educational Institutions, NSS volunteers, NGOs, and other Legal Aid Clinics.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:

The College has an ethics of its own that finds every student enrolled in the College to maintain uniformity and harmony in all respects during their studentship.

1. Every student must be a bona-fide student of the College.
2. Students must follow the academic calendar framed and maintained by the College authority throughout each academic session.
3. Students are required to attend College class at the maximum; those who fail to attend class less than the required quantity as instructed by the council and university shall be termed as defaulter and be debarred from appearing in the examinations.
4. Wearing College uniform in full, possessing Identity card issued by the College, self-Aadhaar card is necessary while attending the College. Identity card should be hung visibly around the neck.
5. Only College uniform in proper style suitable for academic environment is acceptable. Highly fashionable and odd-fashioned dresses, costly ornaments, luxuries are not acceptable inside the classroom and the campus. Odd-looking hairstyle is not encouraged.
6. Only prescribed textbooks, pens, exercise books, etc. are allowed to bring in the campus and classrooms. Obscene pictures and books, pamphlets and banners, etc. are not permitted inside classroom and the campus.
7. Students will arrive at the College on time (punctually), attend classes in full, and leave the College after class. Joining class at random and leaving the College at odd time is not permitted.
8. Students are prohibited using mobile phone inside the College campus and classrooms. Phones are to be switched off. At the time of examinations, on examination days, no student is expected to bring any mobile phone. If brought accidentally, it should surely be handed over to the Officer-in-charge concerned or any other examination personnel authorized in that regard before the commencement of the examination. Lest, if found later on it will be forfeited.
9. Students should not bring any non- students to the College for any reason. If, on exceptional circumstances brought, it should be reported to the College authority/the principal.
10. Loitering and giggling, chatting and gossiping, mobile gaming in and around the College campus, on the verandah, inside the classroom, etc. are strictly prohibited for all times.
11. Students are accepted to keep the College neat and clean; smoking, littering of any kind, consumption of intoxicants - liquor (alcohols), tobacco, *khaini*, *raza*, *talab*, *saajan*, chewing gums, etc. are strictly banned.
12. No students are encouraged to indulge in any sort of anti-social activities within or without the College. It may harm the College image.
13. Use of College facilities (electronic media, letterhead, seal, etc.) to send, view, or publish any obscene and offensive or illegal materials is strictly prohibited. Violence of it will be a gross offence, and penalty will be given accordingly.
14. Organizing any kind of meeting, procession, sit-in-protest, etc. on the College campus, gate, or outside the entrance without the consent and written permission of the Principal is strictly prohibited.
15. Students should handle and use college property with utmost care. Electric bulbs, fans, electronic gadgets, etc. must be put off after use.
16. Stealing, misusing, damaging or destroying the College property will amount to explanatory call and adequate penalty be ordained to the culprits(s) concerned.
17. All students are imperative to attend and fully participate any College function, program, social gathering, social service, etc. Indiscipline during such program and practice of escapism will be treated as a serious offence and be treated accordingly.
18. Any sort of misbehaviors - bullying, assaulting, intimidating, threatening, and any member of the College community or student community shall not be tolerated in any case. Adequate justification be done to the student concerned.
19. Ragging among students, particularly to the girl-students will be seriously viewed and be treated accordingly. Priority should be given to the girls.

20. All students are encouraged to be environment and eco- friendly in their vision, mission, and work. They are expected to be involved in any such activity organized and conducted by the College from time to time.
21. Students are to park their cycle/motor cycle/bikes/cars at the proper parking zone provided for them. They are to bear the responsibility for any loss or damage of such means of conveyance if left at random, unlocked. No students are allowed to enter the College campus if come in on bikes producing too much noisy sound beyond tolerance, thereby disturbing the atmosphere of the College.
22. Students will read Notice Board almost every day to get the College information up to date. All students are expected to think good, do well, and be good in all respects. Violation of any of the above framed code of conduct by any of the College students may rise to untoward consequences and will amount to expulsion of the student(s) concerned under any circumstances. The decision of the College authority will be finding and final.

3. Using Mobile Phones in the classrooms is strictly prohibited.
4. Every student should attend College at least 75% of working days. Failing students will not be allowed to appear the Council and University Examinations.
5. Every student should maintain strict discipline and consider it his/her duty to behave decently inside and outside the College.
6. Every student should accompany his/her identity card while coming to the College daily.
7. Every student is expected to participate in social activities, College development programs, functions, and ceremonies organized/conducted by the College from time to time.
8. Any student found absent from any type of examination conducted by the College shall not be considered for promotion to the next class.


